



The Arts Council of Algoma and Fringe North International Theatre Festival are partnering together to bring to the Sault #UpTheArts, a multi-arts festival, this August 9th to the 19th.

Opening night will be celebrated on August 9th as part of the Downtown Association's "Downtown Street Party Series". Featured activities will include an Art Battle and Fringe North kids play and buskers.

Children will be able to visit the MS Norgoma in their costume to have their picture taken on the ship and meet a mermaid or a pirate.
